

**INVITATION FOR BIDS**  
**Waterbury Stowe Street STP EH 10(20)**

Sealed bids from pre-qualified contractors shall be accepted until **2:00 PM**, prevailing time on **Friday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2014** at **Waterbury Municipal Offices, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor of the Main Street Fire Station, 43 South Main Street, Waterbury, Vermont** for construction of the project hereinafter described. Bid opening will occur immediately after the bid submittal deadline. The time of receiving and opening bids may be postponed due to emergencies or unforeseen conditions.

Sealed BIDS shall be marked in the lower left hand corner: Bid Documents: Waterbury Stowe Street STP EH 10(20).

Each BID must be accompanied by a certified check payable to the Town of Waterbury for five percent (5%) of the total amount of the BID. A BID bond may be used in lieu of a certified check.

All bidders shall be on the current VTRANS Contract Administration pre-qualified list for “Bicycle and/or Pedestrian (Transportation) Path”, “Roads and Highway (New Construction and Reconstruction of Alignment)” or “Curb and Sidewalk” Categories.

**LOCATION:** Beginning on the northern side of the Thatcher Brook Primary School driveway and continuing northerly along Stowe Street for approximately 2,874 LF, ending at the southerly joint of the Thatcher Brook Bridge, Bridge #36.

**TYPE OF CONSTRUCTION:** Work to be performed under this project includes reconstructing sidewalk and curb, drainage, retaining walls and other appurtenances.

**CONTRACT COMPLETION DATE:** The Contractor shall be substantially complete with the work on or before **July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2014**. Substantial completion shall mean:

- No further disruption or detours to vehicular traffic during peak hours
- No further operations, including but not limited to: earthworks, curbing, drainage, bituminous concrete pavement, retaining wall construction and Portland cement concrete pavement, and guardrail.
- The only work that will be permitted is final topsoil, seeding and mulching and other general site cleanup.

The Contract shall be fully completed on or before **August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014**.

**ENGINEERS ESTIMATE:** For this Proposal the Engineers Estimate falls between \$250,000 and \$500,000.

**PREBID CONFERENCE:** A non-mandatory pre-bid conference will be held for the project on **Tuesday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2014, 2:00 PM at Waterbury Municipal Offices, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor of the Main Street Fire Station, 43 South Main Street, Waterbury, Vermont.** Attendance is highly recommended.

**STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS:** This contract is governed by the Vermont Agency of Transportation (“VTrans”) 2011 Standard Specifications for Construction.

**PREQUALIFICATION OF CONTRACTORS:** All bidders on this project shall be on the Agency of Transportation’s prequalified list under the category Road and Highway Construction or shall have submitted a complete prequalification application to the Agency of Transportation, Contract Administration, a minimum of 7 working days prior to the bid opening. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EEO) CERTIFICATION:** Certification is required by the Equal Employment Opportunity regulations of the Secretary of labor (41 CFR 60-1.7(b) (1)) and must be submitted by bidders and proposed subcontractors only in connection with contracts and subcontracts which are subject to the equal opportunity clause. Generally only contracts and subcontracts of \$10,000 or under are exempt as set forth in 41 CFR 60-1.5. See Appendix A for Contractors EEO Certification Form (CA-109).

**NON-COLLUSION AFFIDAVIT:** All bidders are required to execute a sworn statement, certifying that the bidder has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with such contract. See Appendix B for Debarment and Non-Collusion Affidavit (CA-91). This affidavit must be submitted with the bid.

**DEBARMENT AFFIDAVIT:** All bidders are required to execute a sworn statement, certifying that the bidder has not within the last three (3) years, suspended, debarred, voluntarily excluded or determined ineligible by any Federal or State Agency; does not have a proposed suspension, debarment, voluntary exclusion or ineligibility determination pending; and has not been indicted, convicted or had civil judgment rendered against (it, him, her, them) by a court having jurisdiction in any matter involving fraud or official misconduct within the past three (3) years. See Appendix B for Debarment and Non-Collusion Affidavit (CA-91). This affidavit must be submitted with the bid.

**NON-DISCRIMINATION IN FEDERALLY ASSISTED CONTRACTS:** The Town of Waterbury hereby notifies all bidders that it will insure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the basis of race, color, religion, sex or national origin for an award. This is consistent with the Town’s requirement to comply with provisions of Title VI.

**DAVIS BACON WAGE REQUIREMENTS:** Bidders agree to abide by the Davis Bacon Wage Rate Schedule, which are appended to these Contract Documents.

**BUY AMERICA REQUIREMENTS:** Buy America requirements of 23 CFR 635.410 are applicable to all Federal-aid construction projects. All steel or iron products permanently incorporated into Federal-aid projects, shall be products that have been entirely manufactured within the United States. All manufacturing processes of the steel or iron material, in a product, must occur within the United States to be considered of domestic origin. This includes process such as rolling, extruding, machining, bending, grinding, and drilling. The action of applying a coating to a material is deemed a manufacturing process subject to Buy America. Coating includes epoxy coating, galvanizing, painting, and any other coating that protects or enhances the value of the material.

This requirement does not prevent a minimal use of foreign materials, provided the cost of foreign materials used does not exceed 0.1 percent of the total Contract price or \$2,500, whichever is greater. The cost of foreign steel or iron is defined as its value delivered to the project.
