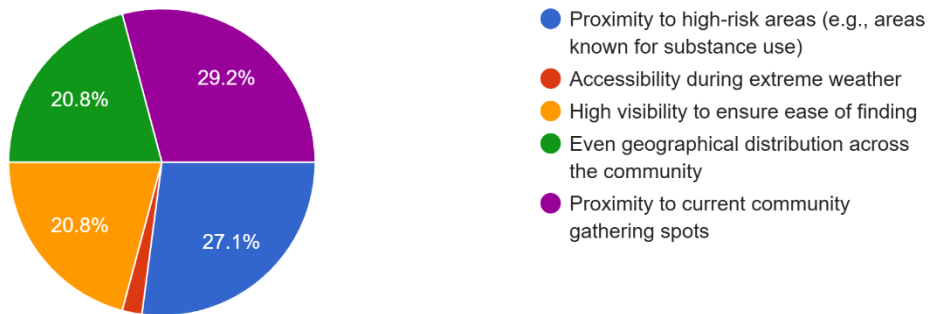

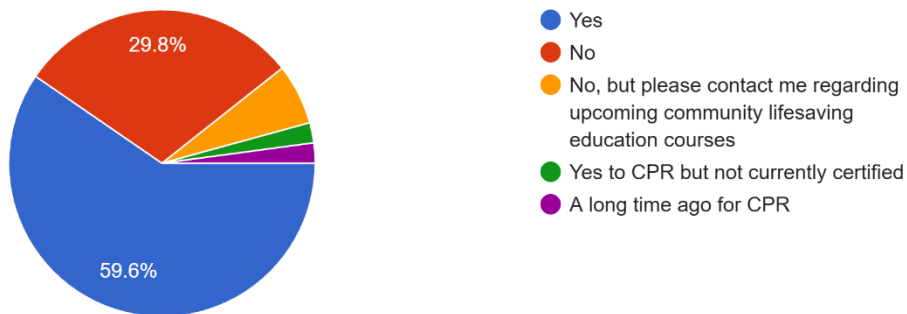
Which factor do you believe is the MOST crucial consideration when selecting the four station locations?

48 responses



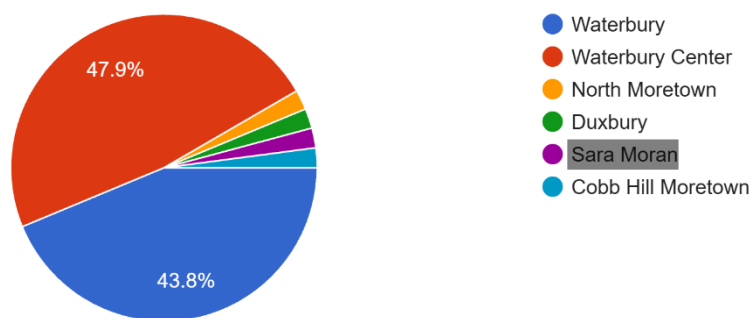
Have you received community CPR/AED or Narcan-use training before?
