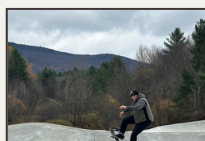

WATERBURY HOUSING IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

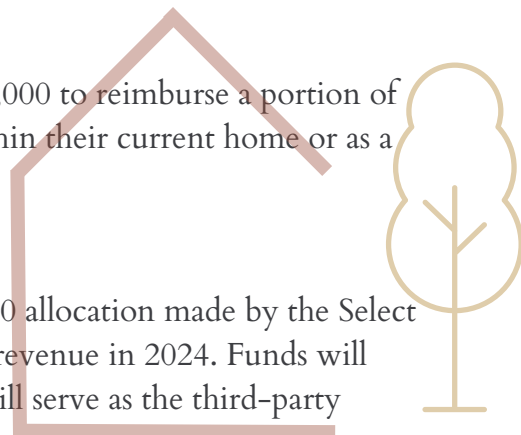
HOUSING TASK FORCE TO OFFER GRANTS TO SUPPORT CONSTRUCTION OF AFFORDABLE RENTAL UNITS

About the program

Waterbury residents can apply for an assistance grant of up to \$30,000 to reimburse a portion of their construction of an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) either within their current home or as a separate structure on their property.

How the program is funded

Grants are funded by Waterbury's Housing Trust Fund, a \$100,000 allocation made by the Select Board as one of three investments of unbudgeted local option tax revenue in 2024. Funds will remain in a Town-managed account, and Downstreet Housing will serve as the third-party administrator of the program.



Eligibility requirements

Applicants must be residents of Waterbury and live on the same property as the ADU.

Affordability requirements

Units must be rented at or below 110% of the HUD Fair Market Rents for a minimum of 5 years.
